

Flying Broom, Turkey's first women's film festival, is like a "patchwork" where different fabrics, textures, colors, and patterns come together in harmony, crafted with labor and care.





As part of the 28th Flying Broom International Women's Film Festival, the Flying Broom Honorary Award will be presented to Hülya Darcan and Gülşen Bubikoğlu; the Bilge Olgaç Achievement Award will be given to Bennu Yıldırımlar, Harika Uygur, and Başak Emre; and the Young Witch Award will be presented to Mina Demirtaş.



### FLYING BROOM HONORARY AWARD GÜLŞEN BUBİKOĞLU

Gülşen Bubikoğlu received education in language, modeling, and dance at the L.C.C. Cultural Center. In 1974, she stepped into cinema through a competition organized by Ses magazine. In the same year, she played her first leading role in the film *Yaban*.

Until the late 1970s, the romantic comedies she starred in achieved great success at the box office. Among these romantic comedies, *Cici Kız, Ah Nerede, Yaz Bekarı, Evcilik Oyunu, Baş Belası,* and *Vahşi Gelin* became classics of Yeşilçam (Turkish cinema).

In the 1980s, she delivered successful performances in films of various genres, including the *Gırgıriye* series, *Leyla ile Mecnun*, İhtiras Fırtınası, *Alev Alev*, and *Kurtar Beni*. Bubikoğlu also appeared in Turkish-Italian co-productions such as *Baş Belası*, Üçkağıtçılar, and Mücevher Hırsızları.

At the 25th Antalya Film Festival, she won the "Best Actress" award for her role in Halit Refig's film *Kurtar Beni*.

The films she acted in were also screened at international film festivals. Gülşen Bubikoğlu represented her country at festivals such as Moscow and Cannes. Throughout her career, Gülşen Bubikoğlu delivered successful performances across a wide range of genres from comedy to drama. She will be presented with an Honorary Award for her contributions to cinema.



### FLYING BROOM HONORARY AWARD HÜLYA DARCAN

Hülya Darcan stepped into the world of cinema in 1967 by placing third in a competition organized by Ses magazine. In the same year, she made a strong debut by sharing the lead role with Fikret Hakan, Ekrem Bora, Çetin İnanç, and Tugay Toksöz in the film *Silahları Ellerinde Öldüler*.

She acted in *Kanunsuz Toprak* directed by Bilge Olgaç, and in *Kanlı Kader* and *Kanunsuz Yaşayanlar* directed by Birsen Kaya. She became a sought-after actress in Yeşilçam action films. She took part in films that achieved significant box office success, working with prominent directors of Turkish cinema such as Lütfi Ömer Akad, Osman F. Seden, Nişan Hançer, and Yılmaz Güney.

Throughout her career, Hülya Darcan has appeared in more than 70 films and TV series. In recent years, she has received great acclaim for her powerful performances in long-running and highly popular television productions.

She has been deemed worthy of the Honorary Award this year for her valuable contributions to Turkish cinema.



## BİLGE OLGAÇ ACHIEVEMENT AWARD BENNU YILDIRIMLAR

Bennu Yıldırımlar studied acting at the Istanbul University State Conservatory Theatre Department and at the Westminster Education Institute in London. In 1985, she began her theater career with Chekhov's Üç Kızkardeşler at the Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality City Theatres. She acted in many important theater plays such as Sartre's Saygılı Yosma, Ahmet Hamdi Tanpınar's Huzur, and William Shakespeare's Richard III. Yıldırımlar is still a member of the Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality City Theatres ensemble.

Yıldırımlar, who also has a successful career in television and cinema, acted in films such as *Eski Fotoğraflar, Kaç Para Kaç, Ahlat Ağacı*, and TV series such as *Yaprak Dökümü, Umutsuz Ev Kadınları, Kadın.* 

In 1994, Bennu Yıldırımlar won the Best Promising New Female Actress award at the Ankara Film Festival for her role in Ağrı'ya Dönmek. Her success in cinema continued with the Sadri Alışık Cinema Awards for Best Actress in 2000 for Kaç Para Kaç and the Best Supporting Actress award at the 51st SİYAD Awards in 2019 for Ahlat Ağacı. In theater, she won the Bedia Muvahhit Award for Bir Atın Öyküsü in 1996, the Ismet Küntay Best Female Actress Award for Huzur in 1998, and the Lions Best Female Actress Award for Saygılı Yosma in 2006.



## BİLGE OLGAÇ ACHIEVEMENT AWARD HARİKA UYGUR

Harika Uygur was born in Istanbul. During the final years of university and afterwards, she worked as an assistant director to Osman F. Seden for many years. In 1994, she joined one of the leading production companies, IFR, and worked as assistant director to Ezel Akay. In 1997, she transitioned to casting director at the same company. After receiving casting director training at Seattle Broadway Hall in 1999, she returned to Istanbul in 2000 and established her own casting agency.

In 2009, she joined the International Casting Directors Guild, which operates under European Film Promotion. In 2011, she was invited by CSA (Casting Society of America), becoming the first international member accepted into this organization.

In 2015, inspired by Yekta Kopan's short story *Fil Mezarlığı*, the short film she directed was selected for the Short Film Corner at the Cannes Film Festival. Since 2011, she has begun sharing her experiences in casting through the seminar and workshops titled *Bu Rol Senin*. This work was later turned into a book, which was published by Destek Publications in May 2016. In the same year, she served on the jury of the Antalya Film Festival's National Competition. In 2017, she was invited to join the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences (Oscar Academy) and won the Best Casting Director Award at the Locarno Film Festival. In 2025, she was nominated for the prestigious CSA Artios Awards in the International TV Series category.

Harika Uygur continues her work as a casting director in television, film, and advertising, and also teaches Chubbuck Method acting classes.




# BİLGE OLGAÇ ACHIEVEMENT AWARD BAŞAK EMRE

Başak Emre is a producer and festival director. From 1988 to 1995, she served as a member of the executive board of the Ankara Film Festival, from 2006 to 2016 she was the world cinema coordinator at the Adana Film Festival, and from 2019 to 2023, she served as the artistic director of the Antalya Golden Orange Film Festival. She was one of the founders of the Traveling Festival, which began in 1995, visiting many cities both in Turkey and abroad and bringing numerous films to the audience, and she managed the festival for many years.

Between 2006 and 2017, she managed the Turkey stands at the Cannes and Berlin Film Festivals. She organized special sections on Turkish Cinema at major festivals in more than 25 countries and served as a jury member at international film festivals.

Among the films she produced and executive produced are İtiraf (2001), Yeraltı (2012), Bulantı (2015), and Kor (2016) directed by Zeki Demirkubuz; Siyah Beyaz (2010) and Paranın Kokusu (2018) directed by Ahmet Boyacıoğlu; and Kars Öyküleri (2008), a film with five directors.

In 2021, Başak Emre became a member of the European Film Academy, and since 2024, she has been serving on the Academy's Executive Board and continues her role as a program consultant for the Cottbus Film Festival.



# YOUNG WITCH AWARD MINA DEMIRTAŞ

The Flying Broom International Women's Film Festival has been presenting the Young Witch Award since 2009 to encourage young female actresses and draw attention to their contributions to cinema. This award, which has previously been given to successful actresses such as Elit İşcan, Damla Sönmez, Ezgi Mola, Neslihan Atagül, Ece Yüksel, Ecem Uzun, Öykü Karayel, Cemre Ebüzziya, Ahsen Eroğlu, and Nazlı Bulum, was given to Mina Demirtaş this year.

Born in 2008, Mina Demirtaş began her acting career at a young age. She first appeared in the 2021 film Âkif. In 2022, she gained significant attention with her performance in Ümran Safter's directed film *Kabahat*, winning the Türkan Şoray Promising Young Actress Award at the 29th Golden Boll Film Festival and the Promising Actor Award at the 23rd International Frankfurt Turkish Film Festival for her impressive performance in the film. In 2023, she stood out with her role in the film *Beraber*, which was featured at the Istanbul Film Festival. Most recently, she became widely known for her leading role in the TV series *Kızıl Goncalar*, receiving great acclaim. She was recognized with awards for promising actors for her performance in this series. For her successful performances at such a young age, Mina Demirtaş received the Young Witch Award at the 28th Flying Broom International Women's Film Festival.
